HOW GREAT THOU ART HYMN HISTORY

If you've only heard a couple of hymns in your life, chances are one of them is "How Great Thou Art." Widely regarded as second in popularity only to "Amazing Grace," it has been covered by artists from Elvis Presley to Carrie Underwood. Interestingly, this beloved hymn didn't begin as a song but as a Swedish poem.

"How Great Thou Art" has a remarkable history, crossing borders and languages before becoming a favorite in English-speaking worship. The hymn began in 1885 as a poem titled "O Store Gud" by Carl Gustav Boberg, a Swedish minister. Boberg was inspired to write it during a powerful storm; overwhelmed by nature's beauty and God's majesty, he crafted a poem of praise.

In the early 20th century, the poem was translated into German, and later into Russian. Eventually, Stuart K. Hine, an English missionary in Ukraine, encountered it. Captivated, he translated the poem into English, adding his own verses. Hine's version is the one we know today.

The hymn became a global sensation in the 1950s, when George Beverly Shea performed it during Billy Graham's evangelistic crusades. Its profound message of God's greatness—from the wonders of nature to the saving work of Christ—resonated with audiences worldwide, solidifying "How Great Thou Art" as one of the most cherished hymns in Christian worship.
